7.3: Best Practice I

- 1. Title of the Best Practice I: Hostel facility
- **2. Goal:** The hostel facility initiated since the establishment of the college which is available to the enrolled students of the campus. The hostel maintains the basic facilities to be suitable for accommodation.
- **3.** The context: The NGES campus has more than ten thousand students studying in various disciplines. Most of the students are from outside this district and remotest areas of the villages and are not able to commute daily. So in order to get themselves educated, they can stay at hostel with very less fees.

By creating groups, the dull students are guided by the senior students. Additionally, the economically poor students are supported by the economically senior students in informal way. Even senior students bring awareness of reading among junior students.
- **3. The context:** The College has become a stage for the students guiding one another in proper direction to grow more. Senior students help junior students to get maximum benefits of the infrastructure of the campus as well as to get the problem- solving skill.
- **4. The Practice:** In order to create a good atmosphere of teaching learning skills the senior as well as junior students are motivated to guide each other. Every year at teacher's day, the senior students deliver lectures to the junior ones to make them realize to remove stage fear.
